



Narrator: Architectural styles of the mid-20th century continue to expand upon the vocabulary of the modern international style. Architects from the early part of the century like Le Corbusier and Frank Lloyd Wright continued their careers evolving their style with the more organic flavor that can be seen in the round shapes of the Guggenheim Museum in New York and Notre Dame du Haut. Other architects created famous landmark buildings that still stand out today.

The Transamerica Pyramid, which is now synonymous with the San Francisco skyline, is by American architect, William Pereira. Lakeshore Drive Apartments in Chicago, those came from these time period by Mies van der Rohe. Surely, you've seen the arch for St. Louis, and that was created by Finnish American architect, Eero Saarinen.

Did you know that he also designed the TWA terminal at JFK as well as the Dallas International Airport in Washington, D.C? Remember, many architects were also involved in furniture design, and Saarinen is the man who developed the Tulip chair, which is the chair that found its way on to the bridge of the original *Star Trek*.
